

Conservation projects from the Nature Conservation Society (NCS)

Information about the NCS

The Nature Conservation Society (NCS) was established in 2005 and officially registered by the Central Environmental Authority (CEA) as environmental NGO in Sri Lanka.

The NCS wants to help saving the unique nature in Sri Lanka and creating a healthy environment for the local communities. As environmental care and conservation are still on a low level in Sri Lanka the NCS runs an awareness program and different conservation activities. Those are for example mangrove nursery and replanting, beach cleaning, gardening, environmental education, replantation activity in the rainforest (with partner organisation), etc.

Mostly nature conservation activities are a team work with the teaching staff of the EDC, the students (green pioneer team) and the volunteers, while gardening work can be done by the volunteers independly.

Working information

Working time:

1-5 days per week – from 8 a.m to lunch time
afternoons

Duty:

Beach cleaning, gradening, magrove/ tree nursery
and replantation, hotel talk (survey), envionmental
education and other activities

Working clothes:

Long or three quarter trousers, t-shirts, shoes or
boots, caps (for the sun)

Mostly team work (e.g. beach cleaning) but also
independently (e.g. gardening)
